TODAY'S OFFERING—Today's offering supports Durham-based Student Action with Farmworkers (SAF), which brings students and farmworkers together to learn about each other's lives, share resources and skills, improve conditions for farmworkers, and build coalitions working for social change. SAF partners with local health, ministry, legal, and migrant education programs to improve conditions for farmworker families in the Triangle and beyond. SAF works closely with Duke, NCCU, UNC, and NC State to raise awareness, recruit volunteers, and foster collaboration to prevent replication of services. 90% of SAF's budget goes to programs and direct services. The majority of the nearly 700 farmworkers who live and work in Durham County live below the poverty line.
