In particular, she has helped to manage and administer academic travel seminars (Pilgrimages of Pain & Hope) for students and alumni in South Africa, Uganda, Rwanda, Peru and Brazil. This program brings home issues of race and class for its ethnically diverse participants, while also instilling a sense of social and theological responsibility.

A native of Whiteville, North Carolina, she was educated at North Carolina State University and Duke Divinity School. Additionally, the Revd Marley is an ordained American Baptist minister. She feels blessed to be able to share her life with her newest family member, Randy Jones, to whom she will be married in October of this year.
