Each of today's scripture lessons emphasizes a thirst to encounter God. In deep despair, Job laments his inability to find God and agonizes over God's silence. The passage in Hebrews identifies Jesus as the great high priest who sympathizes with humanity, and encourages us to approach God's throne of grace with boldness. In Mark, a rich young man seeks out Jesus to learn how to inherit eternal life. And yet, when Jesus encourages him to pursue treasure in heaven rather than on earth, the man goes away bereft, unwilling to part with his riches.

ABOUT TODAY'S GUEST PREACHER

Ched Myers is a native Californian, currently living in Los Angeles. He holds an undergraduate degree from UC Berkeley, and a Masters degree from Graduate Theological Union, Berkeley. Over the past two decades he has worked with several peace and justice organizations and movements, including the American Friends Service Committee, the Pacific Concerns Resource Center and the Pacific Life Community. In 1998 he helped to establish Bartimaeus Cooperative Ministries where Mr. Myers focuses on biblical literacy, church renewal and faith-based witness for justice. He has been an adjunct faculty member at several seminaries, including Memphis Theological Seminary, Fuller Theological Seminary and Claremont School of Theology. His books include: *Binding the Strong Man: A Political Reading of Mark's Story of Jesus* (1988), *Who Will Roll Away the Stone? Discipleship Queries for First World Christians* (1994), and *Say to This Mountain: Mark's Story of Discipleship* (1996, co-authored). Ched Myers writes regularly for *Sojourners* and *The Other Side* magazines, and has published more than 100 articles and essays in those and other periodicals in the U.S., England and Australia.
