The scripture passages for today reveal God's vision for the coming kingdom of God. After the birth and dedication of Samuel, Hannah's song rejoices in the God who reverses fortunes—a God who makes the barren fertile, and lifts up those who are weak and needy to a place of honor. Hebrews shows us that Christ has initiated a new covenant through his sacrifice, where sin is forgotten and we can enter God's house with assurance. In the gospel of Mark, the disciples marvel over the temple, but Jesus won't let them be complacent. Even the grandest representations of human construction will be fleeting in the face of the powerful reign of God.
