Today we celebrate Epiphany, which falls on January 6th and is the climax of the Christmas season and the twelve days of Christmas. Epiphany means "to make known" or "to reveal" and recalls the visitation of the wise men to the Christ-child, revealing to the world that this small infant is Lord and King, worthy of praise and worship. As we celebrate Epiphany this morning, the scripture passages are from the lectionary for December 31. The passage in Luke focuses on another moment of revelation in Jesus' life. Luke tells of when the young boy Jesus is unintentionally left behind after the Festival of Passover, and when his parents discover him, he has been in the Temple, astonishing all the teachers with his questions and understanding.
