# Service of Worship

Seventh Sunday After Pentecost

July 23, 2006

Eleven o'clock in the Morning

In this morning's scripture readings, there is a theme of God's invitation into kingdom living. In 2 Samuel, God rejects David's desire to build a temple in favor of building a dynasty marked by God's abiding presence and holy rest. The passage in Hebrews emphasizes our heavenly calling to walk faithfully as sons and daughters in the house of God, so that our Christian hope may be realized. And in Mark's passage of the feeding of the five thousand, Jesus displays the extravagant hospitality of the kingdom by embracing those without food and ensuring their hunger is satisfied.

ABOUT TODAY'S GUEST PREACHER

We welcome Dr. Ellen Davis, Professor of Bible and Practical Theology at Duke Divinity School, as today's guest preacher. Dr. Davis has been at Duke Divinity School since 2000.
