ABOUT TODAY'S GUEST PREACHER—Today we welcome Dr. J. Kameron Carter as guest preacher. Dr. Carter teaches courses in both theology and black church studies at Duke Divinity School. His academic interests range from systematic theology and theological exegesis to philosophy, literature, and cultural studies. He draws significantly on patristic and medieval approaches to theology in engaging the contemporary theological and cultural imagination. He has a book forthcoming from Oxford University Press titled *Race: A Theological Account* in which he considers the modern construction of race as a theological problem. He is pursuing research towards work tentatively titled *Religion and the Black Intellectual Imagination* and is engaged in a long-term research project which will yield a dogmatic Christology for the 21st century.

VOCAL ARTS ENSEMBLE CONCERT—Tonight at 7:00 p.m., the Vocal Arts Ensemble will present its 10th Anniversary Concert in Duke Chapel, conducted by Rodney Wynkoop. Featured will be a newly commissioned work by Canadian composer Imant Raminsh, "Love Song," a setting of a Rilke poem for chorus and violin solo. Adding to the celebratory spirit of the concert will be a performance of Thomas Tallis' monumental 40-voice motet "Spem in alium," which VAE performed to great acclaim on November 11, 2001.
