

The scripture passages for this morning point to God's glory and power, but also reveal that God laid aside his power *over* creation to come share his life *among* creation. God answers Job out of the whirlwind to remind Job of the breadth of divine majesty and the wonder and mysteries that are beyond human knowledge. However, in Mark, Jesus again points to the upside-down economy of the kingdom of God, calling his disciples to be servants and specifying that he came not to be served, but to serve. Today's scriptures demonstrate the contrast and irony that the Creator and Holder of all mystery chooses to become embodied in frail humanity in order to to reconcile us to him.
