

Today's scripture readings revolve around a theme of faithfulness. In the book of Ruth, Ruth chooses to stay at her mother-in-law's side—an unselfish risk grounded in deep love and loyalty, since the fate of two widowed women in the ancient near-East would have been precarious at best. In Mark, Jesus has harsh words for those religious leaders who enjoy the facade of faithful living, without the cost of genuine obedience. Jesus then lifts up the virtue of a poor widow whose faithfulness is revealed in her giving a few copper coins, despite her lack of resources.
