# Service of Worship

## SERVICE OF HOLY COMMUNION

Sixth Sunday After Pentecost  
July 16, 2006  
Eleven o'clock in the Morning

---

Today's worship features more choral singing than our usual Sunday morning services. The places in the communion service that are typically omitted, spoken, or sung by the congregation will be offered instead by this morning's guest choir from the Royal School of Church Music Carolina Course. Specifically, they will sing three parts of the "ordinary," which is the part of the communion mass whose text remains unchanged from week to week: the Gloria, the Sanctus/Benedictus, and the Agnus Dei. This morning's settings come from a single mass cycle by the Italian Renaissance composer Palestrina called "Missa brevis" or "short mass." The tradition of singing during communion reaches back to the time when Christian worship consisted almost entirely of singing. The choir sings today on behalf of the congregation, allowing the worshiper to participate in a more reflective way and to be moved through music into a "closer walk with God."

*The congregation is asked to remain silent  
during the prelude as a time of prayer and meditation.*
