# Service of Worship

Eighth Sunday After Pentecost

July 30, 2006

Eleven o'clock in the Morning

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*"David and Uriah" by Rembrandt, 1665*

The scripture passages this morning reveal the ways that even those people who seek to be faithful to God are subject to human frailty and the distorting power of sin. David, the king whom God appointed because he was a "man after his own heart," instead pursues a destructive path of adultery, deception, and ultimately murder. In the gospel passage from John 6, the disciples are described as being terrified at the sight of Jesus walking on water in the midst of a dark storm. The disciples of Jesus are led by their anxieties and fears rather than their faith and trust.

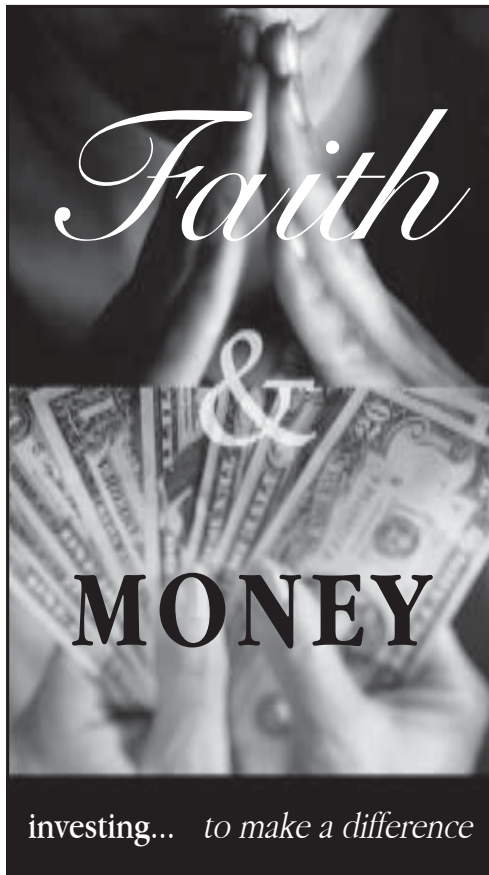
